Freeze a moment in time with your family. This is a picture-frame worthy piece of art, or you can even apply this to a piece of cling vinyl and display it on the rear window of the family vehicle.

Materials:

- different colours of paper
- scissors
- glue
- pencil



1. Have each family member trace their hand on different coloured papers
2. Cut out the hands
3. Glue the hands down onto your canvas, starting with the largest at the bottom and smallest at the top
4. Consider recording the date, names and something special about the time you and your family got to spend together

Alternate activities:

- For older children, ask them to help cut out the hands is a great fine motor activity.
- Ask your child about what their favourite memory was
- Ask your child which hand is bigger and which is smaller, have them order the hands biggest to smallest
- You can also use the hand cut outs as shadows and have them match the shadows to hands
